## The Holy Gospel

Mark 6: 1-13

Jesus came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. Then Jesus said to them, "Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown, and among their own kin, and in their own house." And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief.

Then he went about among the villages teaching. He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

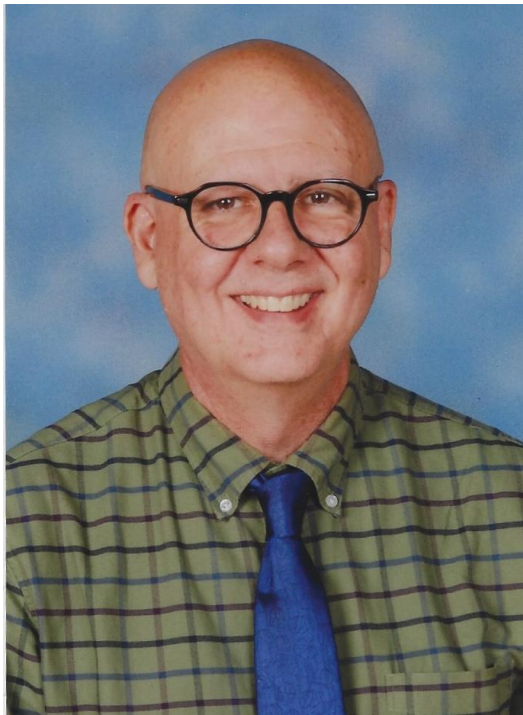

### **Prayer request from Jane Saari:**

*I ask for your prayers for healing. I have been diagnosed with bone marrow cancer and my doctors are treating the symptoms (shortness of breath, dizziness, balance issues, weakness, and fatigue). I receive an injection every three weeks of a drug to treat the anemia and if my hemoglobin is too low, I receive a blood transfusion - I've had three so far. My condition varies from day to day. What I am able to do one day I may not be able to do the next but will be able to do the next. It is unpredictable. It is hard to make plans. There are things I might want to do but can't. Your prayers and understanding will be very much appreciated.*

### **Diapers Needed – Sizes 4 and 6 and Toiletries**

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, we have listened to the needs of our local community and tried to respond faithfully. We've donated lots of diapers, wipes, formula, and more to young, low-income families from Central America in Columbia Heights. St. Thomas' Member Al, serves as a social worker in the community and share that the most needed donations currently are: **diapers in sizes 4-6 and toiletries: toothpaste, shaving cream, deodorant, toilet paper, and feminine products.**

3. We ask the host to bring any food leftovers home with them.

Thank you to Jocko Fajardo for the food suggestions. This helps us prevent food waste, while still having enough food for hospitality each week.
